The Global Center and International Education Residence are scheduled to open in April 2020. The Global Center is equipped with facilities that enable global academic research, while the International Education Residence will help students to manage life and study on campus. Chuo continues to welcome significant numbers of international students and researchers, offering students a unique environment in which to develop interest in global perspectives and encouraging more students to study abroad.

Building Scale:
7 stories above ground, 2,900 m² (total floor area)

Facilities:

Floor 1: Warehouse, Service yard
 Floor 2, 3, 5, 6: Multi-purpose rooms (18 rooms in total)
 Floor 4: Global lounge, University archives display space, Prayer room
 (directly connected to the concourse deck of the monorail station)
 Floor 7: Multi-purpose hall (accommodating up to 150 people), available for international conferences and other events (facilities include a simultaneous interpretation room)

The International Education Residence offers shared spaces that provide opportunities to socialize in daily life while maintaining privacy. The Residence has 50 units, accommodating up to 300 people, and 2 units for families, available to welcome researchers from overseas. The Residence will offer an environment where students and researchers can feel at ease while focusing on their studies, and provide spaces for members of the Chuo community to interact on a daily basis.

Building Scale:
9 stories above ground, 7,400 m² (total floor area)

Facilities:

Floor 1: Entrance, Resident manager room, Laundry room, Guest rooms for international researchers (2 units), Student dormitory rooms (spare rooms)
 Floor 2-9: Student dormitory rooms
 Floor 5: Community lounge, Multi-purpose space, Kitchen, Student dormitory rooms
 (Each unit houses up to 6 students and includes a communal space with a mini kitchen, 1 shower, and 2 toilets)

Faculty Commons (Tentative name) (Tama Campus)

The Faculty Commons, a facility to promote university-wide education and research that transcends the boundaries of faculties, is projected to open in April 2021.

Building Scale: 6 stories above ground, 12,000 m² (total floor area)
