Scholarships

Students at Chuo have opportunities to apply for various off-campus scholarships, including those of both public and private scholarship foundations, as well as its own distinctive

scholarships and tuition reduction programs. Scholarships and tuition reductions for international students are provided for students with a "College Student" status of residence.

International Residences

The Chuo University Tamadaira International Residence opened in 2011 with 62 private rooms (furnished 3-bedroom shared suites), a communal kitchen, and lounge spaces. In addition, the Seiseki Sakuragaoka International Residence opened in 2012 with 94 private apartments containing kitchens and bathrooms. Both residences have a live-in manager, are designed for students to cook for themselves, and provide an environment that enables students to support each other. Various events are organized at the residences, including welcome parties, BBQ parties, sports days, seasonal events, and farewell parties. Furthermore, the new International Education Residence will open on the Tama Campus in April 2020 to promote further globalization through cultural exchange in shared community spaces.



G² (G-Square)

G² (G-Square), Chuo's Global Lounge on the Tama Campus, is a unique space where international and Japanese students can mingle and socialize, and provides support for students eager to become global citizens. G² offers various types of information on study abroad, as well as opportunities to learn about and share different cultures. There is a large screen that displays 9 satellite channels with a variety of programs in Japanese, English, Chinese, Korean and French, and students can select and watch programs using head-sets that they can borrow from the G² reception. G² is an ideal on-campus space for international exchange where students regularly hold social events, cross-cultural seminars, language exchanges, and foreign language discussion groups.



Global Café

The Global Café is an event held in G² where international students become waiters to serve coffee and snacks to Japanese students. While doing so, international students get to chat with the students they are serving. This is a great way to make Japanese friends and practice your Japanese. Be global with us and join our café!



Japan Day

On Japan Day we explore Japanese culture, such as music, calligraphy, dance and so much more with international students. This event is open to all students, so it's a great way to make friends while learning about Japanese culture.



Writing Laboratory
