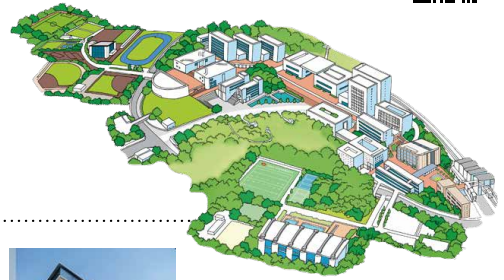


Tama Campus

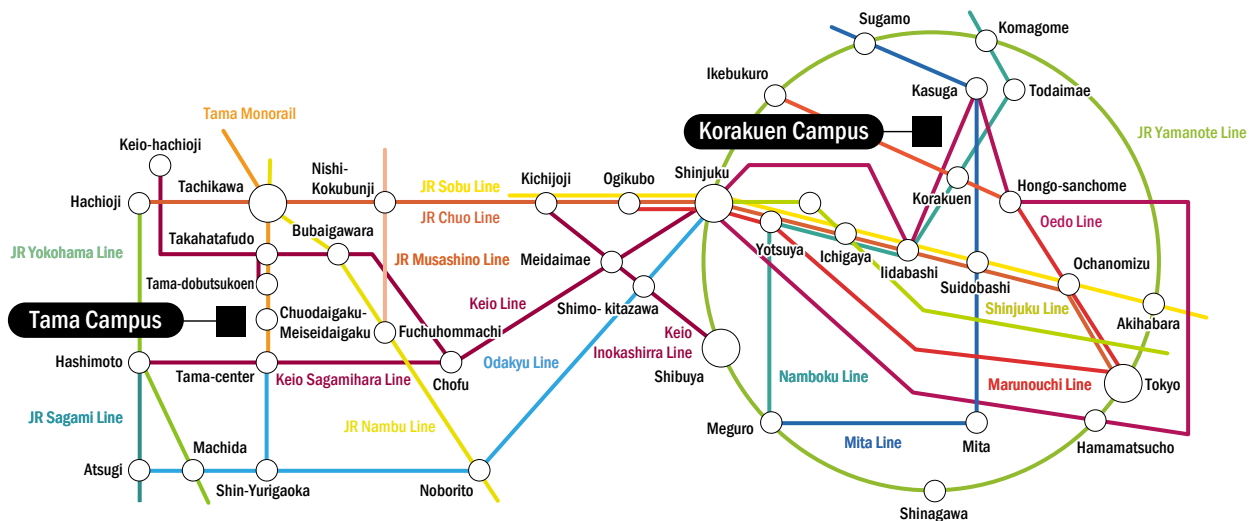
Access 5-minute walk from Korakuen Station on the Tokyo Metro, 7-minute walk from Kasuga Station on the Toei Subway Line

2. The score of the English proficiency requirements (TOEIC, TOEFL, or IELTS) should be within two years before the first day of Application period.

3. Applicants may not apply for more than one faculty that holds the exam on the same day (except **Method B** exams of different faculties).

4. Essay writing questions are to be provided and answered in Japanese.

5. Applicants may not proceed to "2nd Screening" unless they pass "1st Screening."

6. During the interview at the Faculty of Science and Engineering, questions may be asked to confirm fundamental academic abilities in mathematics, physics, chemistry, and biology, etc.

Curriculum

Foreign Students who pass the Entrance Exam for Foreign Student Admission and gone through the admissions procedure are enrolled in the regular curriculum in order to obtain their degree.

As the **classes will primarily be conducted in Japanese** except for the Faculty of Global Management*, a level of Japanese sufficient to understand professional lessons is required. With the exception of subjects exclusively provided for Foreign Students such as “Japanese Language,” Foreign Students will basically take the same classes as Japanese students. Foreign Students are also allowed to participate in the Chuo University Study-Abroad program (for 1 year or 1 semester).

* In the Faculty of Global Management, about 70% of enrollable subjects are taught in English and students can earn the required number of credits for graduation by completing subjects taught in English only.

Student Life

● G-Square (Tama Campus)

An event space for cross-cultural exchange among Foreign Students and Japanese students.

● International Education Residence (Tama Campus)

An on-campus student residence opened in April 2020, where International students and Japanese students can deepen their understanding of diverse cultures through shared living (boarding fees: 62,800 yen/month and other fees).

● Chuo University Co-op

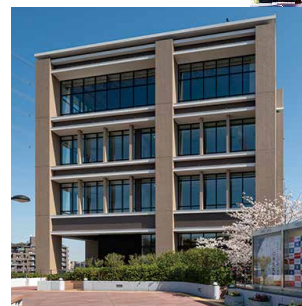
One of Japan’s best university co-ops providing diverse student services such as a cafeteria, retail shops, training for qualifications, travel, insurance, and accommodation services.
